Jewish Social Service Agency Synagogue Liaison Program

This program, subsidized by Federation, offers strategies, consultations and resources for congregants and staff to deal with mental health issues, organizational issues and referrals. Social workers offer consultations that focus on a variety of family and mental health issues from parenting challenges to helping members of a family cope with serious illness and treatment to getting appropriate resources for a disabled family member. Consultations may involve short-term counseling or referral to resources, either concrete or therapeutic, at JSSA or elsewhere in the community.

Synagogue/Agency Partnership Grants

Federation's Synagogue/Agency Partnership grants encourage innovative collaboration between area congregations and Federation's partner agencies by using congregations as sites for delivering agency services to the outlying areas in our community. In addition to their own members, congregations and agencies market these programs and services both to members and others living in adjacent neighborhoods. Some programs and services include an on-site JSSA social worker to offer workshops; JCC-coordinated recreational programs for children and families; and multi-agency sponsored services and programs for seniors including cultural, educational, recreational and social services. CE21 – Congregational Education for the 21st Century

CE21 is a congregation-based guided-change process, led by the Partnership for Jewish Life and Learning, to systemically transform congregational education. It is built around three purposes: to create and implement visionary new models of congregational Jewish learning for members of all ages; to make Jewish learning a central function of the congregation by which congregants come to view Judaism as a source of meaning and community in their lives; and to develop the capacity to continually revitalize congregational learning programs.

Florence Melton Adult Mini-School

The Florence Melton Adult Mini-School (FMAMS) is an exciting, innovative 2-year program of basic Jewish learning offered throughout the world. Through discussion of ancient and modern texts, students explore Jewish historical dramas, rituals, culture, ideas, values and practices. Classes begin in the fall and meet weekly for 30 sessions each year.

Me'ah is a two-year intensive adult Jewish learning program of Hebrew College and Combined Jewish Philanthropies' Commission on Jewish Continuity & Education and sponsored by the Partnership for Jewish life and Learning. Jconnect

Jconnect is the premier low barrier, customer friendly gateway for connection and engagement into the Jewish community through information and referral, welcoming programs, volunteering and community events and programs. Jconnect brings together the resources and expertise of JIRS (Jewish Information and Referral Service), JVC (Jewish Volunteer Connection) and the Community Calendar into one holistic entity, providing:

- Responses to inquiries about everything in the Jewish community, including: social welfare concerns, synagogues, youth groups, preschools and Jewish referrals for seniors, their caregivers and their adult children.
- A comprehensive web site for the community.
- A *Seder* match program and information on High Holiday services.
- Federation's welcome wagon programs in our community: *ShalomDC* for Jewish newcomers and *ShalomBaby* for new Jewish babies.
- The creation and distribution of information guides and brochures including: *A to Z: Guide to Jewish Resources for Seniors*, *A to Z: The Jewish Federation Resource Network*, *A to Z: Resources for Special Needs Families*.
- A matching program for volunteering and finding community service opportunities in the Greater Washington area. We can match individuals, sisterhood groups, men's groups, youth groups and more with specific volunteer projects that match their interest.
- A matching program to help B'nai Mitzvah students select a meaningful Bar/Bat Mitzvah project. Whether they are looking for community service or somewhere to direct *tzedakah*, we have ideas and resources that can match up their *Parsha* with their interests and talents. B'nai Mitzvah students may want to participate in one of many ongoing worthwhile projects in the community or even start their own.

Israel Engagement

Israel and International Affairs Commission of the Jewish Community Relations Council (JCRC)

The Israel Early Childhood Educators Institute

This program, funded by Federation and coordinated by the Partnership for Jewish Life and Learning, is a two-year intensive training program to give early childhood educators better knowledge and understanding of Israeli life and culture. Throughout the course, the educators learn and develop hands-on strategies to teach and connect their students with Israel in an age-appropriate way, and develop partnerships with preschools in our sister city of Beit Shemesh. The course includes a trip to Israel for Greater Washington early childhood educators and a trip by the Israeli teachers to Washington.

Israel in DC

Israel in DC connects our local community with contemporary Israeli life and culture. In partnership with local agencies and congregations, Israel in DC provides educational training that enables teachers to create meaningful Israel connections in their classrooms, partners with congregations to explore the place of Israel in congregational life, and introduces people of all ages to the breadth of Israeli culture through films, concerts, literature, sports, theater, and technology. Knesset Israel

Knesset Israel is a three-stage project designed to place engagement with Israel at the center of the congregation. It begins with an assessment of the place of Israel within congregational life. In the second stage, congregations choose a leadership team that includes the rabbi or cantor, lay leaders and professionals. The teams enter a joint learning program that convenes four times in the fall and winter. The study program aids the teams in re-examining and re-envisioning the place of Israel within all aspects of their congregations. The third stage is a trip to Israel in February to participate in a unique seminar under the auspices of Makom and the Jewish Agency For Israel. Upon return each team develops a plan to enhance the place of Israel within their congregation based on its needs and specific requirements.

Partnership 2000 strengthens Israeli society and enhances Jewish solidarity through comprehensive community-building programs and meaningful partnerships between Greater Washington, South Africa and the Beit Shemesh/Mateh Yehuda region in Israel. Federation currently awards grants to Washington-area congregations and the Beit Shemesh/Yehuda Plains region to help initiate projects that will strengthen the link between our two communities.
